

East Tuddenham Parish Council
Minutes of the Meeting held 12th February 2018

(The meeting opened at 7.30pm in the Village Hall)

1. The minutes of the meeting held on 8th January were approved and duly signed.

2. Matters arising from those minutes

- The PC are not aware of interviews taking place thus far for the two interested candidates for the Charities.
- SM passed around flyers giving details for the next meeting with Highways England on Monday 26th February in the Village Hall. CB, AL and SM will distribute to houses in the village. The meeting is open to anyone wishing to give their views, comments or concerns regarding the planned A47 route.
- It was reported that the footpath sign and road signpost brought to the attention of the PC last meeting still require attention. It was also raised that the lay bys have been churned up along Church lane due to the recent diverted traffic from the A47. CC will report these issues to Highways again.

3. Finance:

- Cheque signing took place for the following:-
 - Tony Bradfield – ET website - £45.00
 - East Tuddenham Jubilee Hall – Hire of snooker room for PC meetings - £75.00
 - East Tuddenham Jubilee Hall - £787.50 – returned as paid to PC in error by BACS.

4. Planning:

- 3PL/2018/0019/HOU – Crinoline Cottage, Common Rd – Two storey side extension – no objections
- 3PL/2017/1537/HOU– Green Farm, Mattishall Road – Stone orangery – approved
- 3SR/2018/0001/SCR – East of Tuddenham to Mattishall Water Treatment Works – Proposed water pipeline 4.7km – notification of a screening application – AH provided a description of where the plans show the pipeline will run. This is not expected to have any local impact. AH will find out some more information
- 3PL/2017/1251/O – Common Road - 7 Self build dwellings – the application is still listed as undecided but there is a new revised decision date of 28th February on Breckland's website. SM is liaising with Breckland to find out more information and to question the delay.
- Mr Eden wrote to the Parish Council expressing his disappointment that their Planning Application for a new house in Rotten Row was declined despite support from the Parish Council - the Chairman responded accordingly.

5. Correspondence

- Confirmation has been received that the No.4 Konect bus will continue to run its service regardless of any cuts in money. Amongst those in support of the service was George Freeman MP who outlined his concerns to Norfolk County Council as he recognised it is a real community lifeline.
- CC advised of another Norwich Western Link working group on 22nd February at 5:30pm at Easton Village Hall.
- The works at the junction of Berry's Lane/Barnham Broom Road and Mattishall Road has been completed with new light up bollards on an island.
- CC received correspondence from Norfolk Community Foundation to advise that a small sum of funding

remains available from the Breckland Outdoor Sport and Play Fund and Breckland Council have decided that the fairest approach is to share the funds between parish councils within the parish cluster. The current estimate is that East Tuddenham will receive £889.33 but this may increase. The funding is to be used for recreation provision within 12 months of the payment date.

- *CC received correspondence from Breckland Council reminding Councillors of the importance of keeping their Disclosable Pecuniary Interests and Other Registrable Interests form up to date.*

6. Updates from Councillors

- *SM reported that there has been flooding on Common Road due to drains being blocked. SM will notify Highways.*
- *It was raised that Church Lane is difficult to use when the road conditions are icy due to the incline of the road. This needs to be borne in mind if the A47 access is to be blocked.*

7. Items for the next agenda
