Minutes of the Meeting held 8th October 2018

(The meeting opened at 7.30pm in the Village Hall)

1. The minutes of the meeting held on 3rd September were approved and duly signed.

2. Matters arising from those minutes

- There are no new updates regarding the A47 improvements. IP to advise at next meeting.
- Due to CC being unable to attend tonight's meeting. CC will ensure that the relevant forms are completed next meeting for Bryan Meek's co-option as a new member of the Parish Council.
- The Parish Council have agreed to purchase an outdoor defibrillator to be located at the Village Hall due to it being a central point for the village and close to the sports field. Approval needs to be sought from the Village Hall Committee regarding its siting and fitting it near to an electricity source.
- A meeting has been arranged with the Housing Strategy & Enabling Officer on Friday 26th October 2018. This is to discuss affordable housing in the village. IP and AH will attend this meeting.

3. Finance:

- Precept payment received for £2,037 on 19th September

4. Planning:

- No new planning matters

5. Correspondence

- A letter has been received from Scribe regarding Clerk training in December in Norwich. IP to pass to CC for review.

6. Updates from Councillors

- Food Hub - planning permission has been granted to Condiment Limited to build a processing plant and mill for mint and mustard seeds. The original Broadland Local Development Order had a 10m height restriction but Condiment Limited require a 20m mill to process mustard seeds. This may set a precedent.
- The issue of the delivery sign on the village green, raised at the last meeting, has now been removed.
- It has been agreed that a new dog waste bin is required on Common Road at the bend outside Mock Beggar Hall. IP to approach Breckland to seek approval etc.
- The lay-by on the main Mattishall Road near the Barnham Broom crossroads has a constant problem with fly-tipping. The landowners behind have erected a 6ft wooden fence but unfortunately rubbish is still being thrown over the fence and the owner has to pay to remove this. Larger items are left in the lay-by. IP will contact Highways and Breckland to see if this lay-by can be closed or if not, if the trees and shrubs can be removed to make the lay-by more visible.
