

East Tuddenham Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting held 16th September 2019

(The meeting opened at 7.30pm in the Village Hall)

1. The minutes of the meeting held on 8th July were approved and duly signed.

2. Matters arising from those minutes

- **Highways Rangers Tasks:** -
 - *It is unknown whether the pot hole on Church Lane has been rectified. This will be checked. It was raised that there are speed reminder signs in the village that need cleaning and the ditches opposite the last lot of council houses on the way to Mattishall need clearing. CC will report these to the Rangers.*
- *The East of England Ambulance registration has been returned for more information about the defibrillator. This will be obtained and sent off.*
- *There have been meetings regarding the possibility of affordable housing in East Tuddenham. The wording for a survey and a covering letter has been completed and are due to be printed for distribution in the next Parish Pump. It was noted that this project is still in it's very early stages.*
- *There is no further news on getting a dog waste bin on Common Road at the bend outside Mock Beggar Hall. IP will chase.*
- *A quote was obtained for fencing the children's play area and was submitted with a completed application to Breckland Council for the S106 project money.*
- *There was a response to the advert for a new volunteer to join the Charities Committee. IP approved the appointment of this individual as a nominative trustee. This is for a period of 4 years although he can be re-elected at the end of this period. There is therefore no need for AL to continue on a temporary basis.*
- *LB has contacted the Vicar and is waiting to hear back as to whether the PC can assist in replacing the church notice board. There are formal procedures the church have to adhere to for such things and so it may be that the PC simply donate some money for its replacement.*

3. Finance:

- *No new financial matters this month.*

4. Planning:

- *3PL/2019/0614/VAR – remove cond 5 (closure of access) – Land adjacent Church Cottages, Church Lane*
 - *The PC have no comments*
- *3PL/2019/0842/F – Erection of 4 dwellings & garages – Green Farm, Mattishall Road –*
 - *The PC have received confirmation this application has been approved*
- *3PL/2019/0505/LB – Conversion of outbuilding to one dwelling – The Old Hall, Mattishall Road*
 - *The PC have received confirmation this application has been approved*
- *3PL/2019/1001/O – New self build dwelling and associated works – Land adjacent Common Farm*
 - *The PC will comment that there is currently no site notice to show a planning application has been submitted. It is also incorrect that the application states there is a grass path footpath to the village centre. Finally an agricultural restriction should be placed on the dwelling due to the previous restriction on the pre-existing house.*
- *3PL/2019/1019/F – Rear extension to provide additional storage – Magpie Yard, Traps Lane*
 - *The PC will comment that this needs to be for commercial use only*

- 3PL/2019/0857/HOU – Side extension with room in roof – Fransgreen Bungalow, Sandy Lane
 - The PC have received confirmation this application has been approved

5. Correspondence

- All of the images of East Tuddenham that were submitted to the PC have been uploaded onto the East Tuddenham website. There is a wide array of quality photos of the village. Each PC member will pick their top three and a winner will be chosen from these to send to Visit East of England.
- IP advised we are waiting on Highways to arrange a meeting to come and visit East Tuddenham to discuss the A47 dualling between North Tuddenham and Easton. Local parishes have already submitted their arguments and comments on the works. It is still anticipated that the work will start in 2021.
- A new speed sign rota has kindly been organised by the clerk of Honingham Parish Council to get the process up and running again. IP will pick up the signs shortly for East Tuddenham to begin the rota.
- CC received correspondence from the RAF Benevolent Fund, who are the leading welfare charity for those serving and who have served in the RAF as well as their families. Our World War Two and National Service generation are a shrinking demographic and by 2030 we have lost 400,000 of them. It is vital therefore that we reach these individuals now and make them aware of the welfare support available to them.
