Minutes of the Meeting held 9th March 2020

(The meeting opened at 7.30pm in the Village Hall)

1. The minutes of the meeting held on 10th February were approved and duly signed.

2. **Matters arising from those minutes**

- *Highways Rangers Tasks: - they have visited the village and inspected some drains. Some on Church Lane have been done but some haven't, which has only moved the problem. CC will request the Rangers re-visit and keep on top of these drains. It was also mentioned that the ditches which have been dug out opposite the council houses need to be dug out further along as well. CC will put this request forward as well.*
- *IP and AH have been progressing the plans for affordable housing in the village, which the PC agreed for them to do. There have been a couple of meetings with Breckland and IP and AH have met with two different housing associations: Broadland Housing Association and Hastoe Housing Association . They were impressed with both who came up with designs that were in keeping with the village. They had different ideas as to the numbers of houses and proportion of types of houses they would propose for the site but they were both clear that having them for people in the village only would be a watertight arrangement. AH and IP will add up points they scored to each Housing Association to make a decision.*
- *The land map from East Tuddenham Charities has helped to identify who owns the piece of land where there is an overgrown footpath from the church to the wood. It has been reported to the owner and it will get cut back as soon as the land dries out.*
- *The Public meeting held by Highways England (HE) took place on Monday 2nd March 2020 in the Village Hall. 162 people attended which is the best attendance out of all the other four parishes. The PC would like to encourage parishioners to complete and return their 'Share your View's questionnaire or complete it online. The deadline is the 8th April. The PC have submitted numerous comments and concerns to Highways England.*
- *The PC has had interest from John Baldock for the Parish Councillor vacancy and he attended tonight's meeting to present to the Parish Council a little bit about himself and what he has to offer. An announcement will be made shortly.*
- *Norfolk County Council are going to be re-procuring contracts for bus services soon and asked for our views. The PC submitted their comments regarding changes to the Number 4 bus that serves the village.*
- *Hall Lane street name plate – this new sign has now erected on the green near The Pump..*
